- Discuss the Laundry process and Chemical Dwell Time.
- Identify and apply the principle of service excellence to our work in healthcare.
- Identify when our patients and customers are not happy with their service and the importance of good customer service.
- Participants will be able to explain three environmental Problems to which healthcare facilities contribute and how purchasing changes can reduce these effects.
- Participants will list three costs of supplies that typically are not included in the purchase price
- Participants will state importance of working with an interdisciplinary green team to identify goals.
- Develop a policy and procedure for conducting routine steam sterilizer efficacy testing.
- Describe the recommended practices for monitoring implants.
- Define the various classifications of chemical indicators and discuss their appropriate use.

A. Color Coding Supplies for Clinical Use (2 CEU)

Presenter: Mike Manno

This session will cover a supply chain process involving nursing clinicians input, to improve supply flow in clinical nursing areas by including the VOC. Mike will discuss the use of Lean Six Sigma Techniques to 5S supply rooms as well as par level optimization to best determine labor verses inventory.

B. Cleaning, Testing, and Inspecting Surgical Instruments While Processing Faster and More Accurately (2 CEU)

Presenter: Rick Schultz

This session will identify the primary groups of surgical instruments, and how to eliminate defective instruments from surgical sets, while improving patient safety. You will learn the enemies of instruments and how to care for specialty instruments, such as laparoscopic instruments. Methods to increase the quality and performance of specific types of instrumentation will be discussed.

C. Hospital Cleaning and Disinfection

Cleaning and disinfection of patient rooms, non-patient areas, and isolation units.

D. NHSN, What's It All About? Case Studies and Definitions (2 CEU)

In this session you will learn about the different ways individuals learn, work, and make decisions. Diane will discuss how our learning and working styles influence the ways we interact with others and function in groups, and improve your capacity to work effectively with each other and your community.
